# **Easily Accessible**

The English Lake District positioned in the region of Cumbria sits within the North-West of England

#### By Air

Cumbria is served by a number of airports including Manchester, Liverpool, Newcastle, London, Glasgow and Edinburgh.

#### By Rail

The Lake District is on the West Coast Mainline and is just 2 hours 45 minutes from London Euston, 2 hours from Glasgow and Edinburgh. Manchester has a direct train service from the airport itself taking just an hour.

#### By Car

The Lake District is only 15 minutes away from the M6 motorway. Approximately 4 hours' drive from London, 2 and a half hours from Glasgow and Edinburgh and Manchester is around 1 and a half hours drivetime from the Lake District. The M6 motorway travels through Cumbria — with junction 36 near Kendal, junction 40 at Penrith and junctions 42-44 at Carlisle all accessing the county.

#### By sea

There are ferries from Belfast and Dublin to Liverpool, Holyhead and Cairnryan, the Isle of Man to Lancaster (Heysham) and Northern Europe to Newcastle (North Shields) and Hull. Road and rail networks link these ports with the Lake District, Cumbria

#### **Accommodation -**

- Renovated rail carriages, Ravenglass Two historic camping coaches are being transformed into quirky self-catering accommodation, together with a new sensory garden. Uniquely located in TWO World Heritage Sites: the English Lake District and Hadrian's Wall. Sleep 4-6 people, launching 2021
- <u>Cliff camping, Honister Slate Mine</u> Hanging tents 500 feet high suspended above the valley floor, anchored to the side of Fleetwith Pike. You reach your bed for the night by abseiling down the cliff face.

- MV Swift is the largest new vessel to sail on England's longest lake, Windermere, for more than 80 years. The 300-seater 'steamer' run by Windermere Lake Cruises will be her first full year of service in 2021.
- The Museum at Wordsworth Grasmere 2021 Uncover Wordsworth's radical and creative life in the new and expanded Museum and enjoy breathtaking views of Grasmere Vale from a unique Viewing Platform. Explore the unique collection of some of the greatest treasures from the Romantic age.
- VIP group cruises launched by Ullswater 'Steamers' for 2021, new exclusive sailings for group tour operators on a dedicated heritage vessel, to take in some of the most epic views in the Lake District National Park.
- <u>'Deep Time' Arts programme</u>: Marking Cumbria's Year of the Coast 2021, a new arts programme reflecting the region's long history and multi-layered cultural heritage, is being created. It will include five coastal commissions with international artists including two former Turner Prize winners celebrating depictions of the diverse coastal landscape, people/communities and little-know 'gems'.

#### **2021 MILESTONES:**

- **70th birthday of the Lake District National Park.** Established in May 1951, the Lake District is England's largest National Park, home to its highest mountain (Scafell Pike) and its deepest lake (Wastwater). www.visitlakedistrict.com/explore
- This year marks 30 years since the passing of Alfred Wainwright. Between 1952 and 1966, Wainwright climbed 214 Lake District summits to produce his seven Pictorial Guides. For more than 50 years, Wainwright's meticulous hand-drawn books have been an essential companion for visitors to the Lake District.
- 250 years since Dorothy Wordsworth's birth. Visit Dove Cottage where
  Dorothy wrote her much loved Grasmere Journal and see her bedroom at
  Rydal Mount & Gardens which continues to be owned by the Wordsworth
  family and retains the feel of a lived-in family home.
- 100 years since Donald Campell was born. Campbell whose adventurous exploits cemented his name among the biggest legends of the 20th century was tragically killed on Coniston Water in 1967 whilst attempting to break his own world water-speed record in his legendary Bluebird K7 craft.

#### **2022 MILESTONES:**

Hadrian's Wall marks 1900 years of history. In 2022, it will be 1900 years
(AD 122) since the Roman emperor Hadrian visited Britain and ordered work
to begin on what is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Stretching 73 miles
from Cumbria's west coast across some of the wildest and most dramatic
country in England, you can experience Roman life and epic history in
stunning locations.


## Dark Skies Cumbria

The Lake District, Cumbria is one of the best places in England for a stargazing getaway, particularly during the winter season with over 1,000 stars visible on a clear night – complimented by part of our own galaxy, The Milky Way, majestically stretching across the night sky.

Let your clients be captivated by our dark skies with a range stargazing experiences:

- Sleep under the stars at Castlerigg Hall in one of their 'Hex Pod' glamping pods, fitted with skylights so that you can appreciate the beautiful stars from the warmth and comfort of your pod. To help get a closer look at the stars, guests are also welcome to borrow binoculars from Reception
- Take to the water with a guided wild and open water night-time swim with Another Place under the light of the full moon or during the new moon when you can see the stars more clearly. The Milky Way can often be seen over Ullswater.
- Take a guided stargazing walk at Whinlatter Forest, England's only true mountain forest to stargazer rooms offering incredible views of the night's sky.
- Enjoy an evening of stargazing & bushcraft cookery with Path to Adventure. Learn how to fillet a whole Rainbow Trout and cook it indigenous style over an open fire. You will also have a go at lighting the fire using only traditional methods, such as flint and steel with natural tinder or even try out the fire bow. You'll then have the chance to stargaze out on the open fell beside the Wood.
